BYU LAW STUDENTS:

LEARN FROM THE BEST.

BYU Law boasts a world-class faculty that provides students with an academically rigorous legal education. Full-time faculty publish extensively and teach from their own professional experience in top firms, the private sector, and federal courts. Among the ranks of our faculty are four former clerks of the US Supreme Court.

GRADUATE WITH PROFESSIONAL LEGAL EXPERIENCE.

More than 70% of students participate in externships following their 1L year, with placements in more than 20 countries.

ARE MORE MATURE.

The average age of BYU Law students typically exceeds the national average of 24. In addition, a relatively high percentage of BYU Law students are married and have children.

ASSOCIATE WITH WORLD LEADERS.

BYU Law students meet and assist government officials and religious leaders from approximately 45 countries who attend the International Law and Religion Symposium each fall. BYU Law students are instrumental in hosting the conference, providing logistical support, and working as translators.

POSSESS DIVERSE LIFE EXPERIENCES.

In our rising 2L class:

- More than half of our students have participated in a full-time service mission, in which they lived and served for 18 months to two years away from home, often outside their native cultures.

MAINTAIN A HIGH MORAL AND ETHICAL STANDARD.

Attendance at BYU Law requires students to adhere to the university's Honor Code. This code of conduct:
